His Op Eds, editorials, and articles have appeared in the NY Times, Hartford Courant, NY Post and on the PBS series In the Life.

Last season he was represented on Broadway by Company, which won the Tony Award, The Drama League, the Drama Desk and the Outer Critics Circle Awards for Best Revival of a Musical. His numerous UK productions include Best Musical Awards for Fiddler on the Roof, Moll Flanders and his own version of *The Gondoliers*, with further nominations for his productions of Mack and Mabel, Cabaret, Irma La Douce and Into the Woods. His UK opera work includes productions for the Welsh National Opera and the City of London, Sinfonia as well the Buxton Opera Festival. John has also directed numerous classic plays, including A Midsummer Night's Dream for the New Shakespeare Company, The Wars of the Roses for York Theatre Royal and most recently a major revival of Amadeus for Wilton's Music Hall in London, as well as directing the European premiere of Driving Miss Daisy (Vienna and Zurich) and the regional premiere of *The Madness of King* George III. He is also co-author of the international best-selling Shakespeare for Dummies. John recently directed The Rise and Fall of the City of Mahagonny for Los Angeles Opera and the critically-acclaimed Lucia di Lammermoor for Scottish Opera. His future plans include Peter Grimes for the Metropolitan Opera and a national USA tour of Sweeney Todd.
